Friday, May 17, 2024 - Shotgun Start Time 10 AM




SENIOR CELLY...

JIMMY DOWD, JR: ...is returning to Penn State for an encore performance! Dowd will use his fifth year eligibility to thrill us one more time.



Miracle of '71 At Penn State

The Birth of Hockey Valley Hockey History by Larry Hendry

After graduating with a Ph.D. at Cornell, I joined the PSU Chemistry faculty at age 24. As an avid hockey fan, the first order of business was to put a life size poster of Gordie Howe on my office wall. It was a Christmas present from wife Wendy. Next, I hustled over to the hockey rink to meet the coaches hoping to get some games as a certified college referee. Manager Earl Boal escorted me through a door to the rink and my heart dropped. The ice was surround-ed by "boards" a few inches high. Earl explained that hockey had been absent on campus for 30 years. Disappointed at the facility, I contacted the athletic department and landed an appointment with Dean Robert Scannell who was cordial, no nonsense and direct. I spoke about how hockey was the greatest sport on earth. His view was that hockey was not a suitable sport for Penn State.

A few days later, my spirits were raised when I saw leaflets posted on campus encouraging students to contact Dean Scannell and <u>demand</u> <u>hockey</u>. The organizer behind this effort was freshman Roy Scott. I was able to meet Scotty along with many other hockey enthusiasts including students Dave McCrabb, Jim Graulty, Bill Charles, Reds Davidson and Bryan Martin who helped garner 3,000 signatures on a petition for hockey at the student center.

Within the next few months, I had four additional meetings with the Dean. Preparation included a carefully written outline, a new tie (made by wife Wendy) and haircut. In Meeting 2, the Dean responded that signatures were nice but like his alma mater Notre Dame, hockey would never appear on campus. In Meeting 3, despite having a group of students joining me, the answer was again no. In Meeting 4, Dr. Scannell expressed concerns about the high cost of hockey, scarcity of ice time, lack of any community interest... I countered that we will pay for unused ice time, equipment, build boards, sell advertising, attract investors... The school could make money on us! Again, no was the answer.

The community interest issue was of major concern. Dave McCrabb decided to camp out at the Nittany Mall with his 1 1/2 year old daughter Kelly in hockey garb. The result was 3,800 additional signatures (6,800 total). I informed Dean Scannell by phone but he was unmoved.

Accepting defeat, I arranged an office meeting to announce the bad news. Dave sat on the windowsill next to Gordie and uttered "you can't give up now." Other students were similarly enraged and encouraged me to call the Dean and ask for a final meeting. I reluctantly complied and hustled over to Rec Hall to meet with the Dean for the last time (Meeting 5). I underscored the McCrabb petition and 6,800 signatures. I failed again with a **NO**!

As I was exiting the building defeated, I was surprised when the Dean's receptionist called me back to the office. Dr. Scannell asked me, "Did you say that you would take full responsibility for the program?" I answered, "Yes Sir, please just give us a chance. Nothing will be done without your full knowledge and approval." His last words were, "I'll see what I can do."

An eruption of joy occurred when I arrived back in my office. Two days later, I received a phone call from a member of the Dean Scannell's Staff Hal White who informed me that he was appointed as my liaison for hockey development. Over the

next few months, the Ice Pavilion morphed into a hockey rink. An artist created a team logo and program cover, the ice was laboriously painted five times; we obtained an ice cutter machine, paint, sticks, goals, netting, jerseys... All were obtained at cost or free. Hockey was open to all Penn State men and women students, faculty and staff. Several hundred signed up resulting in an A Team ("Varsity"), B Team ("JV"), and 5 intramural teams. Youth hockey was initiated.

In 2021 junior forward Dylan Lugris started attending the Covotes sled hockey team's weekly practices, eventually having teammates join him. To support them, Dylan created the Penn State Sled Hockey Classic, a charity sled hockey scrimmage between the Coyotes and the men's hockey team at Pegula in front of the passionate PSU fanbase. Since the initial Classic in February 2023, the Coyotes have more than doubled in roster size and are members of the Northeast Sled Hockey League, thanks in large part to the near \$50,000 Dylan and his team have raised for the Coyotes organization.

Lugris was named one of five finalists for the 2024 Hockey Humanitarian Award, as announced by the Hockey Humanitarian Award Foundation. The 2024 Hockey Humanitarian Award will be presented on Friday, April 12th during the NCAA Men's Frozen Four weekend in St. Paul, Minn. "I love this award and am so happy for Dylan for what he has done; it speaks volumes to who he is as a person and the culture of hockey ." - Guy Gadowsky
